PSAC Social Justice Fund invites you to participate in the next Education In Action project in Guatemala for 2 weeks in spring (month of March), 2015.

The Education In Action (EIA) organization is supported in part by the PSAC Social Justice Fund and engages Canadian volunteers to deepen their understanding of Guatemala and building solidarity by working closely with the Comité Campesino del Altiplano (CCDA) who are strengthening communities in Guatmala.

CCDA is a grassroots' co-operative working to protect the rights of subsistence farmers in Guatemala. They implement programs that provide financial assistance to small producers; promote gender equality and strengthen women's programs. The CCDA promote access to land, agrarian reform, labour rights and encourage the formation of women groups including supporting micro projects empowering women.

EIA is engaged in the building of new homes for families in need, and also provides support to CCDA's education programs, their fair-trade coffee "Café Justicia", their medical centre in Quixayá, the support of a teachers salary and more. http://education-in-action.squarespace.com/

Education In Action Application Form 2015

The application:

- a) You will be notified once your application is reviewed.
- b) You must be 18 years and older to be eligible.

CRITERIA

The arrangements for reserving the group's ariline tickets will be done by the PSAC Social Justice Fund. The tickets will be reserved for purchase in mid - December 2014 and you will be required to cover the cost of your airline tickets at that time. From past years, the average cost from Toronto International Airport to Guatemala (and return) is \$900. Then you have to add the amount from your departing region to Toronto.

Average example rates only: These rates are subject to change.

Ottawa: \$400 Calgary: \$625 Edmonton: \$700 Yellowknife: \$800

- Your participation fee (equivalent to \$600 US) is required in Canadian funds. This fee covers your travel in the country, accommodations and meals. Payment will be expected at the end of January 2015.
- Participants will be notified of the payment schedule. Failure to meet the payment schedule without making other arrangements will be deemed as withdrawal from the tour.
- You will be required to have a valid passport.

- Education In Action reserves the right to cancel this tour for reasons such as: not reaching the required number of participants for the tour; if deemed unsafe for reasons beyond our control; etc. Should the tour be cancelled, you will be notified and you will be refunded for your payments.
- You will be required to participate in 2 separate days of orientation prior to traveling. This can also be done via teleconferencing for those not able to be present on-site.
- You will be required to attend a gathering upon return on a mutually-agreed date, to reflect and share experiences. This can also be done via teleconferencing for those not able to be present on-site.
